Dear Director Dreher:

Idaho Rivers United wishes to amend its two water right protests and petition to intervene for State of Idaho water rights proposed for aquifer recharge on the Snake River. Subsequent to our original protest of water right no.'s 02-07473 and 02-07474 in the mid-Snake reach near Twin Falls, Idaho dated May 19, 1998 a new water right public notice was published on July 9 and July 16 in daily newspapers throughout southern Idaho. At the time of our May 19, 1998 protest we submitted protest fee payment of \$50 for the two aquifer recharge rights and \$25 to protest three combined water rights by Mitch Sorenson. Apparently only one fee of \$25 was necessary for the aquifer recharge rights and one fee of \$25 for the Mitch Sorenson protest. We would appreciate a refund of \$25 or a credit.

Idaho Rivers United maintains its original two protests for all the reasons cited in the protest on May 19, 1998. In addition, we protest and petition to intervene in these additional water right applications for aquifer recharge in the name of the state of Idaho:

Idaho Rivers United members use and enjoy the Snake River, Henry's Fork of the Snake and its tributaries and the Fall River. Our members specifically use these rivers for recreational boating, fishing, wildlife viewing, hunting, photography, and contemplative recreation. Our members value the biological diversity these rivers provide.

We are extremely concerned that the proposed aquifer recharge projects could potentially de-water the stream segments of the Henry's Fork region and further adversely impact the upper Snake and mid-Snake. Further depletion of wintertime flows or spring runoff could impair the recreational experience; cause adverse

impacts to resident fish and wildlife; adversely impact endangered snails, salmon and sensitive sturgeon; reduce instream flows; reduce flood flows which contribute to stream health and function; raise water temperatures and further impair water quality. The issuance of these water rights may cause irretrievable impacts to the ground and surface waters of the Upper Snake Plain aquifer and the Snake River and its tributaries.

In summary, we believe that approval of these twenty water right applications are not in the "local public interest" under IC 203A(5), are contrary to the conservation of water resources within the state of Idaho, and may be speculative in terms of the amount of water actually available and time frame of availability.

Idaho Rivers United requests that a hearing be scheduled to consider the public impacts that these twenty water right applications may have. We recommend denial of the water right applications until such hearing occurs. Laird Lucas of the Land and Water Fund of the Rockies is designated counsel for Idaho Rivers United. Mr. Lucas should be served with all correspondence related to this matter, as well as the protestant.
