TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This is a statement concerning the Water Rights and the water that was available at the time we farmed at Sunnyside, near Lave Hot Springs, Idaho.

The land we farmed from the Spring of 1947 through 1950, is presently owned and farmed by Golden and Vera Avery and their family.

The water in the Sunnyside Canal, was available in the spring, whenever the share holders decided it was needed or as soon as the Canal could be cleaned and made ready.


As the growing seasons became hotter, there was less water available to this Canal Company, and sometimes, we were cut down to three streams of about 50 inches of water each at the headgates.

In the fall, after the heavy demand for water was over, the water was kept in the canal as long as anyone wanted it, or until it was frozen.

The summer of 1950, I was hired by the Canal Company as Ditch Rider. I started as soon as I got out of school, about May 20th, and had the job until I quit, September 25th, to take another job. At that time, my Dad took the job for the rest of the season.

The information in this letter is as close as I can remember.
