# Draft Memorandum of Agreement between the Idaho Water Resource Board and the Owners of Conversion Projects

### **Issues for Discussion**

## Water Supply:

Incentives: IWRB provides water at a discount to conversion project users based on the length of the agreement.\*

- Provide IWRB rental pool water at a discount rate off the annual cost of in-basin rental pool water (see Table).
- Provide rebate to sponsors who provide surface water from a source other than the IWRB. This encourages the use of other surface water supplies to offset IWRB's limited supply of water.
- Discount is greater for longer term agreements.

#### **Associated Costs:**

- Conveyance Fees:
  - a. Sponsor pays fees directly to the conveyance company.
  - b. IWRB provides a rebate directly to the Sponsor to offset the costs.
  - c. Rebate is based on the term of the agreement.
  - d. Rebate is not issued to projects without conveyance needs.
  - e. Under this scenario, an agreement between the canal company and the IWRB is not necessary.

- Operation and maintenance: Sponsor pays all operation and maintenance costs.
- Monitoring equipment: IWRB provides and installs all monitoring equipment, but may not pay costs required to significantly modify the existing system. Sponsor is obligated to participate in monitoring plan.

## **Early Termination and Reimbursement (Penalties):**

- Approach 1: Sponsor is required to reimburse the IWRB based on all discounts and rebates received by the sponsor up to the date of termination.
- Approach 2: Sponsor is required to reimburse the IWRB costs associated with anticipated future water savings or benefits to the aquifer.

- Can an MOA be executed quickly for interested 2009 AWEP applicants to allow them to move forward?
  - Draft an MOA without incentives (water supply discounts and conveyance fee rebates).
  - MOA should provide for monitoring and reporting.
  - Allow for a contract amendment once the incentive plan has been approved.
