



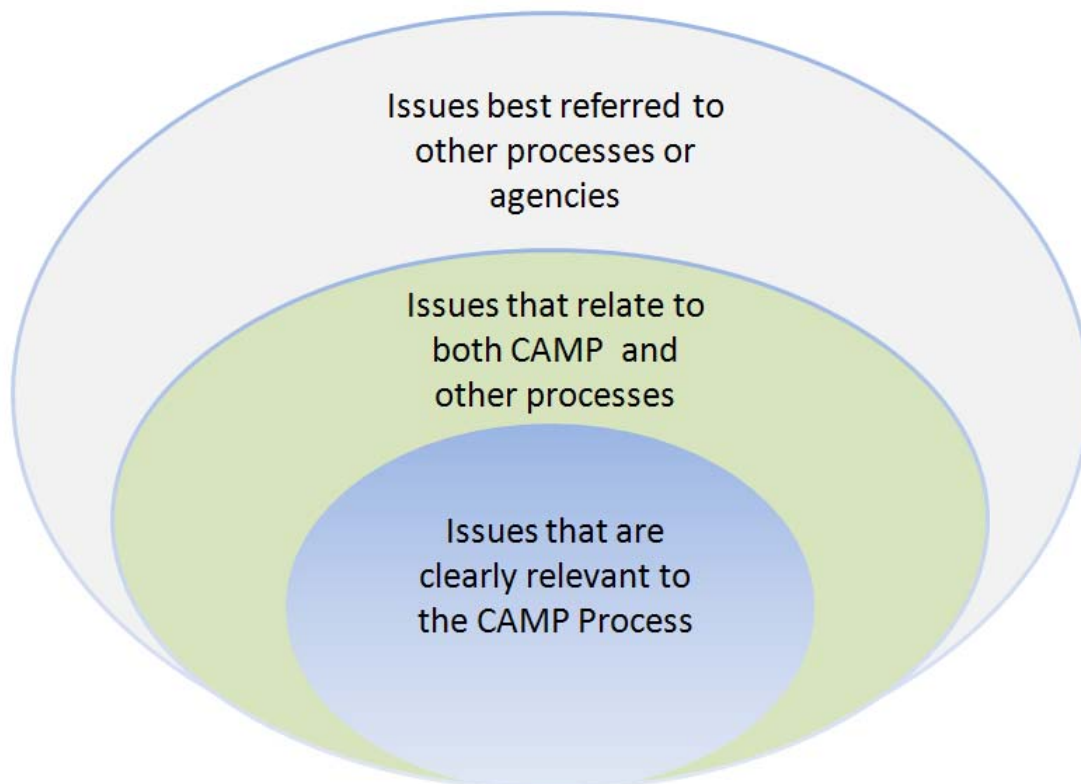
Moving Forward and Maintaining Focus

To effectively and timely accomplish the Advisory Committee tasks, the Facilitation Team recommends that the Advisory Committee periodically consider whether the issues proposed for consideration and eventual recommendation are within the scope of the CAMP. The Facilitation Team has noted that issues that are very important to the basin future many nonetheless be outside of the CAMP scope.

The principal purposes of the CAMP process are to:

1. Provide reliable sources of water, projecting 50 years into the future.
2. Avoid conflict related to conjunctive management of surface and ground water (i.e., the experience in the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer).
3. Prioritize future state investments in water.
4. Bridge the gaps between future water needs and supply.

We suggest that there may be three broad categories that the Advisory Committee may use to determine how it should use its time – as noted below. The four purposes listed above are in the core of the CAMP work.



We recommend that the Advisory Committee focus its initial work on: (a) identifying the issues that fall into each of the broad categories above; and (b) undertaking the issues that are clearly relevant to the CAMP. At appropriate points the Advisory Committee can then determine how to address issues in the other two categories.
