







The Water Transaction Program Philosophy


- Improve ESA-listed fish habitat by increasing stream flows and reconnecting tributary streams
- Respect private property rights using a voluntary cooperative approach
- Respect the values of irrigated agriculture
- Work locally using market-based strategies to maintain local economies and traditional land uses
- Take a balanced approach



Iron Creek



A change in point of diversion in 2007 resulted in an additional 7 cfs in Iron Creek throughout the irrigation season. In 2009, adult Chinook salmon were observed spawning in Iron Creek for the first time in decades.






Pole Creek






A full-season minimum flow agreement has resulted in a minimum flow of 5 cfs in Pole Creek for the past 5 years.




Patterson Big Springs Chinook Redds



Fourth of July Creek




A full-season lease over the last 6 years has resulted in a 3 cfs flow improvement in Fourth of July Creek. An increasing trend in fluvial bull trout redd numbers has been observed by IDFG. A 20-year lease was negotiated in 2009.




