

What is a Water Right?

- The constitution and statutes of the State of Idaho declare all the waters of the state, when flowing in their natural channels, including the waters of all natural springs, lakes and groundwaters within the boundaries of the state, to be public waters
- A water right is the right to divert public waters and put them to a beneficial use in accordance with one's priority date. See I.C. § 42-230

Idaho is a Prior Appropriation State

- "First in time is first in right"
- The earlier (senior) priority date rights must be satisfied before the later (junior) priority date rights can be delivered
- This becomes important when the source (available supply of water) is not sufficient to meet the demand
- A water right allows the private use of Idaho's public water

Ways to Establish a Water Right

Permit Process

• The permit process became mandatory to establish new water rights from:

March 25, 1963	Ground water diversions (except for domestic and/or livestock uses as defined in I.C. § 42-111)
May 20, 1971	Surface water diversions (except for watering livestock directly from streams as defined in I.C. § 42-113)

- Decrees Previous Court Actions
- Beneficial Use (aka constitutional or grandfather)
 - Posted Notice
 - Statutory Claim
 - Unrecorded Use

What is a Water Rights Adjudication?

- Adjudicate To Settle Judicially
- Process to make a complete and accurate record of all existing water rights through the court




Why Adjudicate Water Rights?

- Record and confirm beneficial use rights
- Confirm private property rights
- Idaho population growth continues
- Only way to confirm Statutory Claims
- Record changes and make corrections to water rights




- Protection against competition for finite resources
 - \circ $\,$ Supplies are not always sufficient to meet demands $\,$
 - During times of scarcity Idaho relies on priority administration

Purpose of the Bear River Basin Water Rights Adjudications


42-1406C: "Effective management of the waters of the Bear River basin requires that a comprehensive determination of the nature, extent and priority of the rights of users of surface and ground water be determined."



BRBA Background


- 2020 Legislative Session
 42-1406C authorizes the Bear River Basin Adjudication
- November 20, 2020 Attorney Generals office files Petition to commence the Bear River Basin Adjudication
- June 15, 2021
 Commencement order is issued by Judge Wildman
- January 30 and April 10, 2023 Basin 11 Commencement Notices mailed
- October 20 and December 8, 2023

Basin 11 Filing deadlines




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Adjudication Process



Commencement Notice Mailing Groups

- IDWR has a statutory obligation to send notice to all property owners
- Filing deadlines will be for no less than 90 days (generally > 6 months)
- Notice in Basin 13 will be sent in two groups, separated by the Bear River
 - First group of mailings expected in March

TO: ALL PERSONS OWNING RIGHTS TO THE USE OF WATER WITHIN THE BEAR RIVER BASIN WATER SYSTEM

The purpose of this notice is to inform you of the commencement of the Bear River Basin Adjudication and your legal responsibilities at this stage of the adjudication. You are receiving this notice because you may be the owner of property located within the boundaries of the Bear River Basin Adjudication.

I. YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT

On June 15, 2021, the Fifth Judicial District Court in and for the County of Twin Falls issued an order commencing a general adjudication of water rights within the Bear River Basin water system in Idaho. A general adjudication is a court case which will result in a decree determining all water rights within a water system. The purpose of the adjudication is to determine the elements and necessary provisions for the administration of water rights and to compile an inventory of all the water rights in the Bear River Basin water system. Adjudication of all water rights in the Bear River Basin will ensure proper delivery of water in times of shortage and to ensure certainty of water right ownership to property owners.

What Water Rights need to be Claimed?

<u>All water uses and water sources</u> must be claimed

- Existing Water Right Licenses
- Existing water rights decreed in prior adjudications
 - Example: Dietrich, Cub River, Trout Creek decrees, etc.
- Statutory Claims, Beneficial Use water rights
- Municipalities, water districts, and water delivery organizations (canal companies) are responsible for filing claims for the uses on their systems
- State and Federal entities included
- Permits where proof was submitted after June 15, 2021, are not required to file



Domestic Use



Domestic/Stockwater Deferral

- Water users can choose to defer (postpone) filing for small Domestic & Stockwater rights (I.C. § 42-111)
- Filing fees for deferrable
 Domestic and/or
 Stockwater claims are \$25
- <u>Deferral is not forever</u>. There will never be an easier or cheaper time to file on your domestic and stock water claim than now.

How the Adjudication Affects Water Right Holders

The Court will issue a "Partial Decree" for each claim that appears in the Director's Report

Delivery of water (if or when required) will be based on the partial decree for each right

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Preparing to File your Claim

Who, What, When, Where, How?

- Who does the water belong to (claimant)?
- What is being used (source)?
 What uses are occurring (domestic, irrigation, commercial etc.) and quantity?
- When did the use begin? If things have changed, when?
- Where is the diversion occurring and where is it being used (legal descriptions)?
- How is it being used? Provide a description of the system and map



Preparing to File your Claim

Location Information:

- Tax Documents or parcel information
 - Parcel (PIN) number
 Ex: RP11S43E120149A
 Township, Range, Section, QQ
 Ex: T11S, R43E, S12, NENE
- Parcel information
 Can be found on the county assessor's website

Preparing to File your Claim (cont.)

Proof of Priority Date



• Priority Date is the date the water was first used

Claims to water rights that are based on development through beneficial use require evidence of priority:

- Statutory Claim
- Unrecorded beneficial use claims
- Posted Notice

What can I use as Proof of Priority?

- Irrigation claims crop reports, income tax documents showing sale of crops
- Affidavits
- Property tax documents showing property was taxed as agriculture land
- Historical Aerial Photography
- Newspaper Articles

What is not proof of priority


- Statutory Claims a statutory claim is NOT evidence of the priority date on the claim.


