Agenda Item No. 2, Public Comment

There was no public comment

Agenda Item No. 3, Authorization to place in the Water Resource Board's Water Bank a portion of Water Right Permit No. 01-07054 held by the Water Resource Board for recharge

Mr. Anderson introduced Director Dreher to present item No. 3. Mr. Dreher briefed the board on the department's activities for recharge. He stated that Mr. David Blew had canvassed the canal companies to see which ones might be able to divert water early to maximize recharge. Director Dreher also outlined the Governor's office pilot plan for addressing the

recharge issue. He had met with the Governor on this issue. He also mentioned that a recent Attorney General's opinion had been issued which addressed two issues regarding the Swan Falls Agreement. The opinion stated that recharge is a beneficial use to which some water rights are subordinate. The Swan Falls Agreement statutes passed in 1984 made hydro power rights subordinate to current and future water uses above the minimum stream flows established at Swan Falls. The flows above the Swan Falls minimums were put in trust for state management.

He further explained that it might be necessary to use the water board's water right permit by the Lower Snake Aquifer Recharge District to divert water to the Shoshone recharge site. The department's intent is to begin recharge on March 15.

Chairman Rigby called for questions and Director Dreher responded to Board members' questions. Vic Armacost moved to adopt the resolution before the Board authorizing the transaction. Gary Chamberlain seconded.
