



Background on 2018

House Bill 712 passed and approved by the 2018 Legislature included a FY 2018 transfer of \$1,000,000 from the General Fund to the Water Management Fund in the Department of Water Resources budget. This funding was intended for a grant program administered by the Idaho Water Resource Board to provide statewide competitive grants for flood-damaged stream channel repair, stream channel improvement, flood risk reduction, and flood prevention projects.













2018 Program Timeline

- Grant Criteria & Application/Guidance established in May 2018
- Round 1 Applications Due in June
- Round 1 Funding Awarded in July
- Round 2 Applications Due in August
- Round 2 Funding Awarded in September
- Project Implementation is on-going













2018 Funded Projects


Staff received a total of eighteen (18) applications during the two rounds of funding. The applications and sponsor's grant documents were evaluated, scored, and ranked according to criteria adopted by the Board. The Board authorized funding for fourteen (14) projects throughout Idaho for a total of \$1,000,000.

Background on 2019


House Bill 285 passed and approved by the 2019 Legislature included a transfer of \$21,000,000 from the General Fund to the IWRB's Water Management Account for:


- Anderson Reservoir Enlargement and/or MHAFB Water Supply Project (\$20 M),
- FY 2019 Flood Management Grant Program (\$800K)
- Mid-Snake Water Quality Monitoring and Modeling effort (\$200K).

Several of the 2018 Flood Management Grant projects were completed under budget, with remaining funds totaling \$70,000, so there was \$870,000 for 2019 Flood Management Grant projects.













2019 Program Timeline

- Grant Criteria & Application/Guidance established in April 2019
- Applications Due in June
- Funding Awarded in July
- Project Implementation is on-going













2019 Funded Projects

Staff received a total of twelve (12) applications. The applications and sponsor's grant documents were evaluated, scored, and ranked according to criteria adopted by the Board. The Board authorized funding for ten (10) projects throughout Idaho for a total of \$869,697.

Future of Program?

- Legislature has funded both years with "one-time" appropriations through IDWR's budget
- General expectation is "one-time" appropriation means one time
- Therefore not included in IDWR budget request
- Governor Little's office has directed agencies to limit budget requests
- To become permanent program this would need to become an "on-going" appropriation in IDWR's budget
