IN THE MATTER OF THE MOUNTAIN HOME AIR FORCE BASE SUSTAINABLE WATER PROJECT A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
AND PROVIDE SIGNATURE AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Idaho Water Resource Board (Board) is a constitutional agency of the State of Idaho and empowered by Idaho Code 42-1734 to acquire, purchase, leases or exchange land, rights, water rights, easements, franchises and other property deemed necessary or proper for the construction, operation and maintenance of water projects; and

WHEREAS, the Mountain Home Air Force Base (Base), as well as surrounding municipal and agricultural uses, draws its water supply from the Mountain Home Aquifer, which is overdrafted by approximately 30,000 acre-feet annually and declining approximately 2 feet per year; and

WHEREAS, there are also water quality issues in some of the wells that the Base depends on for its water supply; and

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho recognizes the economic value of the Base to the local and state economy and supports the United States Air Force in achieving its national security functions; and

WHEREAS, the Mountain Home Air Force Base is one of the largest employers in Idaho. A 2019 Economic Impact Analysis for the Base, done by Boise State University, found there are 4,531 people in either military or civilian employment at the base and found the total economic impact from the base to be approximately \$793 million; and

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho, in partnership with the United States Air force, is working on the Mountain Home Air Force Base Sustainable Water Project, the purpose of which is to provide a sustainable, long-term water supply for the base from the Snake River and eliminate the Base's reliance on the declining Mountain Home Aquifer; and

 WHEREAS, the project generally consists of a pump station at C.J. Strike Reservoir and a 14.4 mile long pipeline to bring Snake River water to the Base, as well as a water treatment plant at the Base; and

WHEREAS, in 2014, with funds provided by House Bill 479, the Board purchased senior-priority Snake River Water Rights from the J.R. Simplot Company to provide a sustainable water supply to the Base; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the United States Air Force, at its cost, will build the water treatment plant, and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that upon project completion, the State will transfer ownership of the pump station and pipeline, and the Air Force will assume operations and maintenance responsibility for the entire project; and

WHEREAS, the 2019 Idaho Legislature passed Senate Joint Memorial 104 expressing support of the Mountain Home Air Force Base Sustainable Water Project; and

WHERAS, the 2019 Idaho Legislature passed House Bill 285, which appropriated \$20 million to the Water Management Account to be used by the Board for, among other purposes, the Mountain Home Air Force Base Sustainable Water Project; and

WHEREAS, the 2021 Idaho Legislature passed Senate Bill 1121, which appropriated \$50 million to the Water Management Account to be used by the Board for, among other purposes, the Mountain Home Air Force Base Sustainable Water Project; and

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho, through the Office of the Governor and the Board, has been negotiating with the United State Air Force on a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the Mountain Home Air Force Base Sustainable Water Project; and

WHEREAS, the Memorandum of Understanding with the Air Force is ready to be executed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the attached Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Idaho and the United States Air Force and authorizes the Chairman to sign the memorandum on behalf of the Board.
