ORDER STAYING THE ORDER REVISING APRIL 2013 FORECAST SUPPLY

(METHODOLOGY STEPS 6 - 8)

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On August 27, 2013, the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Director" or "Department") issued his *Order Revising April 2013 Forecast Supply (Methodology Steps 6 – 8*) ("Steps 6 – 8 Order"). The Steps 6 – 8 Order provides that American Falls Reservoir District # 2 ("AFRD2") and Twin Falls Canal Company ("TFCC") are expected to experience material injury, as shown in the following table:

2. As stated in the Steps 6 - 8 Order:

At this time, the current, predicted shortfall to the SWC's RISD is 105,200 acrefeet. However, consistent with the Methodology Order, "junior ground water users are required to provide the lesser of the two volumes from Step 4 (May 1 secured water) [14,200 acre-feet] and the [DS] volume calculated at the Time of Need [105,200 acre-feet]." *Methodology Order* at 37. IGWA has secured 14,200 acre-feet of storage water for mitigation. *Order Confirming IGWA's Notice of Secured Water*.

Based on current information, the Time of Need is predicted to occur on August 29, 2013. Because the Time of Need is reasonably certain, the Director will not implement Step 7 for this irrigation season. *Methodology Order* at 37. No later than August 29, 2013, the 14,200 acre-feet of mitigation water secured by IGWA must be provided to AFRD2 and TFCC, as explained in the following paragraph.

The current, predicted shortfall to the SWC is 105,200 acre-feet. AFRD2's portion of the shortfall is 54,000 acre-feet, or 51.4% of the current, predicted shortfall. TFCC's portion of the shortfall is 51,200 acre-feet, or 48.6% of the current, predicted shortfall. Using the above percentages to allocate the 14,200 acre-feet of mitigation water, 7,300 acre-feet shall be provided to AFRD2, and 6,900 acre-feet shall be provided to TFCC.

Id. at 7.

- 3. On June 24, 2013, prior to the issuance of the Steps 6 8 Order, the Idaho Ground Water Appropriators, Inc. ("IGWA") mailed a letter ("IGWA letter") to the Watermaster of Water District 01, informing the Water District of IGWA's intention to provide 14,200 acre-feet of storage water to TFCC. A copy of the IGWA letter is attached hereto. According to the IGWA letter, IGWA wished to "fully satisfy its mitigation obligation by assigning 14,200 AF of storage water to TFCC" To date, according to Water District 01, approximately 10,000 acre-feet of the 14,200 acre-feet identified in the IGWA letter have been assigned to TFCC.
- 4. The Steps 6-8 Order directed the Watermaster for Water District 01, no later than August 30, 2013, to assign 7,300 acre-feet to AFRD2, and 6,900 acre-feet to TFCC. The Watermaster has notified the Director of potential confusion between the Steps 6-8 Order and the IGWA letter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Rule 780 of the Department's Rules of Procedure states as follows:

¹ As stated previously in footnote 1, the Director has determined the reference in Methodology Order Step 8 to "RISD" is incorrect and should instead reference "DS." As such, the Director has removed RISD from the above quotation and replaced it with DS.

Any party or person affected by an order may petition the agency to stay any order, whether interlocutory or final. Interlocutory or final orders may be stayed by the judiciary according to statute. *The agency may stay any interlocutory or final order on its own motion.*

IDAPA 37.01.01.780 (emphasis added).

2. In order to ensure that water is appropriately assigned between AFRD2 and TFCC, and in accordance with Rule 780, the Director stays implementation of the Steps 6-8 Order. The Director will issue a subsequent order lifting the stay.

ORDER

Based upon and consistent with the foregoing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

The Order Revising April 2013 Forecast Supply (Methodology Steps 6 - 8) is STAYED until further notice from the Director.
