RE: Notice of Pending Curtailment of Non-Enlargement Ground Water Rights with Priority Dates Junior to April 12, 1994 and Enlargement Ground Water Rights Junior to March 14, 1971 - Surface Water Coalition Delivery Call

Dear Water Right Holder,

You are receiving this letter because, according to the records of the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department"), you are the holder of one or more ground water rights subject to curtailment pursuant to the attached June 7, 2019, curtailment order issued by the Director of the Department in response to the water delivery call by members of the Surface Water Coalition ("SWC"). The SWC includes A&B Irrigation District, American Falls Reservoir District #2, Burley Irrigation District, Milner Irrigation District, Minidoka Irrigation District, North Side Canal Company, and Twin Falls Canal Company. The SWC called for delivery of their water rights under the Department's Rules for Conjunctive Management of Surface and Ground Water Resources (IDAPA 37.03.11) ("CM Rules").

The SWC delivery call applies to ground water rights for irrigation, commercial, industrial, municipal, non-exempt domestic uses, and other consumptive uses. Non-consumptive uses and culinary in-house uses of water are not subject to curtailment under the order.

The curtailment order requires that, at 12:01 a.m. on or before June 21, 2016, ground water users holding non-enlargement ground water rights bearing priority dates junior to April 12, 1994 and enlargement ground water rights junior to March 14, 1971 within the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer area of common ground water supply ("ESPA ACGWS"), and listed in Attachment A to the order, must curtail/refrain from diversion and use of ground water pursuant to those water rights, unless notified by the Department that the order of curtailment has been modified or rescinded as to their water rights. The curtailment order also requires that watermasters for the water districts within the ESPA ACGWS who regulate ground water are directed to review the water rights listed in Attachment A to the order and begin contacting the water right holders in their respective districts to evaluate and determine how the water rights will be curtailed.

Because you are the holder of one or more ground water rights listed in Attachment A to the curtailment order, you must curtail/refrain from any diversion under the above referenced water right(s) in compliance with the order, unless and until you receive further direction from the Department or watermaster after the watermaster has consulted with the Department.

The curtailment order explains that holders of ground water rights affected by the order may participate in an approved mitigation plan, such as the plan filed by the Idaho Ground Water Appropriator's Inc. and SWC in Docket No. CM-MP-2016-001. The ground water right holders shall have fifteen days to join, solely for mitigation purposes, the ground water district situated nearest the lands to which the water rights are appurtenant. *See* H.B. No. 737 (*Act Relating to the Administration of Ground Water Rights Within the Eastern Snake River Plain*, ch. 356, 2006, *Idaho Sess. Laws* 1089) and Idaho Code § 42-5259. Holders of ground water rights affected by the curtailment order may also submit a proposed mitigation plan to the Director in accordance with CM Rule 43. *See* IDAPA 37.03.11.043. Upon receipt of a proposed mitigation plan, the Director will publish notice for two successive weeks, after which ten days will be allowed for the filing of protests. The Director will then hold a hearing as necessary to determine whether a proposed mitigation plan will mitigate injury to the SWC caused by the ground water rights at issue. If holders of ground water rights affected by this order do not participate in an approved mitigation plan by June 21, 2019, the Director will curtail the junior priority ground water use.

The Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department") finds, concludes, and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On April 19, 2016, the Director issued the *Fourth Amended Final Order Regarding Methodology for Determining Material Injury to Reasonable In-Season Demand and Reasonable Carryover* ("Methodology Order"). The Methodology Order established nine steps for determining material injury to members of the Surface Water Coalition ("SWC").¹

2. On April 11, 2019, the Director issued the *Final Order Regarding April 2019 Forecast Supply (Methodology Steps 1-3)* ("As-Applied Order"), which applied steps 1, 2, and 3 of the Methodology Order. The Director predicted an in-season demand shortfall ("DS") of 20,900 acre-feet. *As-Applied Order* at 3-4. The Director ordered that, by May 1, 2019, ground water users with consumptive water rights "junior to August 25, 1991, within the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer area of common ground water supply ("ESPA ACGWS") shall establish, to the satisfaction of the Director, that they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS of 20,900 acre-feet in accordance with an approved mitigation plan." *Id.* at 6. The Director also ordered that, if such a junior ground water user cannot establish they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS "in accordance with an approved mitigation plan, the Director will issue an order curtailing the junior-priority ground water user." *Id.*

3. On May 22, 2019, the Director received the Water District 01 Water Report ("Water Report"). The Water Report stated that the Twin Falls Canal Company ("TFCC") leased 5,049.9 acre-feet to the Supplemental Pool according to Water District 01's Rental Pool

Procedure 8.2.a.²

4. There are currently six approved mitigation plans in place responding to the SWC delivery call:

(1) Docket No. CM-MP-2009-007 for the benefit of the Idaho Ground Water Appropriators, Inc. ("IGWA") (delivery of stored water);

(2) Docket No. CM-MP-2009-006 for the benefit of IGWA (conversions, dry ups and recharge);

(3) Docket No. CM-MP-2016-001 for the benefit of IGWA (the IGWA and SWC stipulated mitigation plan);

(4) Docket No. CM-MP-2010-001 for the benefit of the Southwest Irrigation District and Goose Creek Irrigation District (collectively, "SWID");

(5) Docket No. CM-MP-2019-001 for the benefit of certain cities commonly referred to as the "Coalition of Cities"; and

(6) Docket No. CM-MP-2015-003 for the benefit of the A&B Irrigation District ("A&B").

5. In the 2019 As-Applied Order, the Director found that due to the nature of the approved mitigation plans for SWID, IGWA and the Coalition of Cities, these entities do not need to establish they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS. *See As-Applied Order* at 5, note 4. However, the Director concluded that A&B must mitigate for its proportionate share of the predicted DS of 20,900 acre-feet and determined that A&B's proportionate share is 2,121 acre-feet. *Id*.

6. On April 23, 2019, A&B filed with the Department A&B Irrigation District's Petition for Reconsideration and Request for Hearing Re: April 2019 As Applied Order[;] Notice of Non-use ("Petition"). In its Petition, A&B requests reconsideration of the Director's determination that A&B's "'proportionate share of the predicted DS of 20,900 acre-feet is 2,121 acre-feet." Petition at 2 quoting As Applied Order at 5, note 4. A&B also requests a hearing regarding the Director's determination of A&B's proportionate share of the predicted DS. Id at 3. A&B also provides "notice of non-use of its junior ground water rights subject to the [As-Applied Order] for the 2019 irrigation season." Id. at 4.

7. On May 1, 2019, the Coalition of Cities submitted a *Notice of Participation in Cities' Mitigation Plan* to the Department, identifying ground water users participating in the Coalition of Cities mitigation plan for 2019.

8. On May 14, 2019, the Director issued an *Order Granting Request for Hearing* in response to A&B's Petition. Granting the request for hearing does not stay the effectiveness of

the Methodology Order, the As-Applied Order, nor this Final Order Curtailing Non-Enlargement Ground Water Rights Junior to April 12, 1994, and Enlargement Ground Water Rights Junior to March 14, 1971. Order Granting Request for Hearing at 2. The Order Granting Request for Hearing also states the Director will address A&B's statements of non-use in this order. Id.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Idaho Code § 42-602 authorizes the Director to supervise water distribution within water districts:

The director of the department of water resources shall have direction and control of the distribution of water from all natural water sources within a water district to the canals, ditches, pumps and other facilities diverting therefrom. Distribution of water within water districts created pursuant to section 42-604, Idaho Code, shall be accomplished by watermasters as provided in this chapter and supervised by the director. The director of the department of water resources shall distribute water in water districts in accordance with the prior appropriation doctrine. The provisions of chapter 6, title 42, Idaho Code, shall apply only to distribution of water within a water district.

2. As explained above, by May 1, 2019, ground water users with consumptive water rights "junior to August 25, 1991, within the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer area of common ground water supply" had to "establish, to the satisfaction of the Director, that they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS of 20,900 acre-feet in accordance with an approved mitigation plan." *As-Applied Order* at 6. If a junior ground water user does not establish that they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS "in accordance with an approved mitigation plan" the ground water user will be subject to this "order curtailing the junior-priority ground water user." *Id.*

Based on the Water Report discussed above, the Director should decrease the forecasted DS by 5,049.9 acre-feet, the amount TFCC rented to the Supplemental Pool. The Methodology Order states "water supplied to private leases or to the rental pool by a SWC member will be included as a part of the SWC supply for that member because non-inclusion would unjustifiably increase the shortfall obligation." Methodology Order at 13; *see also* IDAPA 37.03.11.42.01.g and *American Falls Reservoir Dist. No. 2 v. Idaho Dept. of Water Resources*, 143 Idaho 862, 880, 154 P.3d 433, 451 (2007). Furthermore, when an SWC member leases storage water into the rental pool following a determination of a demand shortfall for that SWC member and the storage water is rented, the rental pool lease in/rental out of storage water is per se evidence that the senior water right holder does not need the water. Therefore, the revised predicted DS is 15,850.1 acre-feet and the revised priority cutoff date is April 12, 1994, for non-enlargement water rights and March 14, 1971, for enlargement water rights.

3. Due to the nature of the approved mitigation plans for SWID, IGWA and the Coalition of Cities, these entities do not need to establish that they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS. Junior ground water users entitled to the protection of the SWID, IGWA and Coalition of Cities mitigation plans will not be subject to curtailment during the 2019 irrigation season.

4. As discussed above, A&B's Petition notified the Director that it "will not deliver groundwater pursuant to its referenced ground water rights subject to the [As-Applied Order] this irrigation season. Consistent with the Director's June 30, 2016 letter concerning this same issue, A&B presumes that the referenced water rights will be removed from the curtailment list as A&B will not deliver groundwater pursuant to these rights this irrigation season." Petition at 4. In 2016, A&B similarly stated that it would voluntarily curtail its enlargement water rights but then exercised its enlargement water rights. *Final Order Denying A&B Irrigation District's Petition for Reconsideration* at 2 (Dec. 20, 2016).

5. To ensure that A&B's enlargement water rights are curtailed for 2019, the Director will place the enlargement water rights on the curtailment list. The Director will instruct the Watermaster to confirm that A&B is not diverting ground water pursuant to its enlargement water rights. A&B will not have a mitigation obligation for this year if A&B curtails the enlargement ground water rights and if the priority date for curtailment for 2019 remains junior to A&B's other ground water rights.

6. Consistent with the As-Applied Order, the Director will order curtailment of junior-priority ground water users that have not established they can mitigate for their proportionate share of the predicted DS in accordance with an approved mitigation plan. Junior-priority ground water users subject to curtailment are listed in Attachment A to this order.

ORDER

Based upon and consistent with the foregoing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, at 12:01 a.m. on or before June 21, 2019, ground water users holding water rights bearing priority dates junior to April 12, 1994 and enlargement water rights bearing priority dates junior to March 14, 1971, within the ESPA ACGWS listed in Attachment A to this order shall curtail/refrain from diversion and use of ground water pursuant to those water rights unless notified by the Department that the order of curtailment has been modified or rescinded as to their water rights. This order shall apply to consumptive ground water rights, including but not limited to, agricultural, commercial, industrial, and municipal uses. This order excludes ground water rights used for *de minimis* domestic purposes where such domestic use is within the limits of the definition set forth in Idaho Code § 42-111 and ground water rights used for *de minimis* stock watering where such stock watering use is within the limits of the definitions set forth in Idaho Code § 42-1401A(11), pursuant to IDAPA 37.03.11.020.11.

feet to 15,580 acre-feet results in a reduction to A&B's proportionate share of the demand shortfall to 1,945 acre-feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that watermasters for the water districts within the ESPA ACGWS who regulate ground water are directed to review the water rights listed in Attachment A to this order and subject to curtailment and begin contacting the water right holders in their respective districts to evaluate and determine how the water rights will be curtailed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that holders of ground water rights affected by this order may participate in an approved mitigation plan through a ground water district and shall have fifteen days from the issuance of this order to join, solely for mitigation purposes, the ground water district situated nearest the lands to which the water rights are appurtenant. *See* H.B. No. 737 (*Act Relating to the Administration of Ground Water Rights Within the Eastern Snake River Plain*, ch. 356, 2006, *Idaho Sess. Laws* 1089) and Idaho Code § 42-5259. Holders of ground water rights affected by this order may also submit a proposed mitigation plan to the Director in accordance with CM Rule 43. *See* IDAPA 37.03.11.043. Upon receipt of a proposed mitigation plan, the Director will publish notice of the proposed mitigation plan for two successive weeks, after which ten days will be allowed for the filing of protests. The Director will then hold a hearing as necessary to determine whether a proposed mitigation plan will mitigate injury to the SWC caused by the ground water rights at issue. If holders of ground water rights affected by this order do not participate in an approved mitigation plan by June 21, 2019, the Director will curtail the junior priority ground water use.

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A FINAL ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was not held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 740.02)

The accompanying order is a "Final Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5246, Idaho Code.

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a final order within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order as shown on the certificate of service. Note: The petition must be <u>received</u> by the Department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See section 67-5246(4), Idaho Code.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless the right to a hearing before the director or the water resource board is otherwise provided by statute, any person who is aggrieved by the action of the director, and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter shall be entitled to a hearing before the director to contest the action. The person shall file with the director, within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice of the action issued by the director, or receipt of actual notice, a written petition stating the grounds for contesting the action by the director and requesting a hearing. See section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. Note: The request must be received by the Department within this fifteen (15) day period.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, any party aggrieved by a final order or orders previously issued in a matter before the department may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in the matter to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of: a) the service date of the final order, b) the service date of an order denying petition for reconsideration, or c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration, whichever is later. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not in itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.
