Gary – this is even more complex than when I first looked at it. The Nash irrigation right has been split several times. Since I wanted to print all the water right proof copies to update the water district file, I just scanned the whole stack for you. (Hint: the originals were double sided, so if you want to print the pdf I would recommend that you print the same way if you can, otherwise you'll get blank or nearly blank pages). I attached a map showing how it all fits together. The water rights are labeled but you'll have to zoom in.

Here's my quick analysis:

Original right was 36-4260, 10.50 cfs for commercial, irrigation, domestic, stockwater.

Recommended for Decree:

36-4260A – Sportsmans Resort, 0.40 cfs for domestic, commercial, 4 ac irrigation

36-4260B – Nash, 10.06 cfs for domestic, 164 ac irrigation

36-4260C - Salmon Falls L&L, .04 cfs for stock, domestic

Parts A & C were decreed as recommended.

Part B was split for the first time prior to decree. Since then it has been split multiple times to these resultant rights:

36-16165

36-16221

36-16733 (Nash)

36-16734

36-16735

36-16875

36-16905

Nash still retains the lion's share of Part B under 36-16733, 9.73 cfs for 154.3 ac irrigation plus domestic use. This right will continue to be reduced as additional ownership changes are filed. Theoretically, the splits should total the original. Presently, the irrigation acreage does total 164 but the cumulative rate has increased to 10.12 for a total under all rights of 10.56 cfs. Not sure how this happened but we will try and sort it out next time we process a spit. Total diversion pursuant to all splits should be limited to 10.50 cfs.
