Box 50130, Idaho Falls, ID 83405; and A&B Irrigation District, American Falls Reservoir District #2, Burley Irrigation District, Milner Irrigation District, Mindoka Irrigation District, North Side Canal Company, and Twin Falls Canal Company (collectively the "Surface Water Coalition"), through counsel Travis L. Box 248, Burley, ID 83318, submitted to the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department") a Joint Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department") a Joint Motion for Order Extending Settlement Between Pocatello,

Coalition of Cities, Idaho Falls and Surface Water Coalition ("Interim Mitigation Plan for 2017").

On March 15, 2016, Pocatello, the Coalition of Cities, Idaho Falls, and the Surface Water Coalition ("SWC") (collectively, the "Parties") submitted to the Department an Interim Mitigation Agreement ("Interim Mitigation Plan for 2016") proposing mitigation activities the Parties agreed would "constitute full mitigation activities the Parties agreed would "constitute full mitigation" for any injury to members of the SWC in 2016 associated with junior-priority ground water pumping by Pocatello, the Coalition of Cities, and Idaho Falls. Interim Mitigation Plan for 2016 at 2 The Interim Mitigation Plan proposed delivery of 2,600 acre-feet of storage water to the SWC and recharge activities estimated to benefit the Near Blackfoot to Neeley and Neeley to Minidoka Reaches of the Snake River. In April 2016, the Department published notice of and approved the Interim Mitigation Plan for 2016.

The Parties "desire to extend the Interim Mitigation [Plan] for 2017." Interim Mitigation Plan for 2017 at 3. The SWC "agrees to accept 2,600 acre-feet of storage water" and "to recognize a 488 acre-feet recharge benefit in 2017" attributable to recharge activities as "mitigation for any injury" to SWC members in 2017 associated with junior-priority ground water pumping by Pocatello, the Coalition of Cities, and Idaho Falls Id.

The Department will process the Interim Mitigation Plan for 2017 pursuant to the Department's Conjunctive Management Rules (IDAPA 37.03.11).
