

NOTICE OF MITIGATION PLAN SUBMITTED BY THE UPPER BIG LOST RIVER GROUND WATER ASSOCIATION

Notice is hereby given that, on October 13, 2017, the Upper Big Lost River Ground Water Association ("Association") submitted to the Idaho Department Water Resources ("Department") a Mitigation and Aquifer Enhancement Plan of and for the Upper Big Lost River Ground Water Association Users ("Mitigation Plan") pursuant to Rule 50.04 of the Department's Water Distribution Rules for Water District 37.03.12.050.04) Water 34 (IDAPA and the Department's Rules for Conjunctive Management of Surface and Ground Water Resources (IDAPA 37.03.11).

The Mitigation Plan states the Association "functions mainly for the purpose of mitigation" and "the purpose of mitigation is to augment the natural flow of the Big Lost River downstream from Mackay Dam to replace water that would be available in the river absent the diversion and use of ground water." Mitigation Plan at 1. The Mitigation Plan also states "it is intended to meet the requirements of mitigation by augmentation of the natural flow of the Big Lost River" and that "Association Users ground water rights currently represent 12.67% of the total licensed Ground Water CFS in Basin 34."

The Mitigation Plan "describes categories from which water supplies may be obtained to mitigate withdrawal and use of ground water for consumptive purposes," including "stored water in the Mackay Reservoir" and "[a]ll of part of the water available from a valid existing right to divert the flow of the Big Lost River." Id. at 2. The Mitigation Plan states the Association may "use other means of mitigation including, but not limited to, consumption reduction by crop management, irrigation pivot end gun use reduction or non-use, diversion limitation or other creative means." Id. The Mitigation Plan describes "current aquifer stabilization/enhancement efforts" such as "managed recharge efforts," "potential and future stabilization/enhancement methods," and "other means and methods to achieve ground water demand reductions" such as "[g]round water to surface water conversions." Id. at 5.

The Department will process the Mitigation Plan pursuant to Rule 50.04 of the Department's Water Distribution Rules for Water District 34 (IDAPA 37.03.12.050.04) and pursuant to the Department's Rules for Conjunctive Management of Surface and Ground Water Resources (IDAPA 37.03.11).
