NOTICE OF MITIGATION PLAN SUBMITTED BY NORTH SNAKE GROUND WATER DISTRICT IN RESPONSE TO THE SURFACE WATER COALITION WATER DELIVERY CALL

Notice is hereby given that, on December 20, 2023, North Snake Ground Water District ("NSGWD"), through counsel Thomas J. Budge, PO Box 1391, Pocatello, ID 83204-1391, and on behalf of NSGWD members, submitted the Petition for Approval of NSGWD's Mitigation Plan for the Surface Water Coalition ("Mitigation Plan" or "Plan") to the Idaho Department of Water Recovered ("Department") ment of Water Resources ("Department").

The Plan is intended to satisfy the mitigation obligations of NSGWD for the Surface Water Coalition ("SWC") Water Delivery Call administered by the Department and watermasters of state water districts who administer ground water rights within the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer ("ESPA"). The SWC consists of irrigation water delivery entities that hold senior surface water rights diverted from the Snake River above Milner Dam. The SWC members include A&B Irrigation District, American Falls Reservoir District #2, Burley Irrigation District, Milner Irrigation District, Minidoka Irrigation Disprict, Namer Frigation District, Milliowa Frigation District, North Side Canal Company, and Twin Falls Canal Company. NSGWD represents members who hold ground water rights within a portion of the ESPA that are junior in priority to the SWC's senior priority Snake River water rights.

NSGWD proposes to mitigate injury to all the SWC members by providing to the SWC an amount of water equivalent to what the SWC would receive from curtailment under the SWC delivery call pursuant to the Sixth Final Order Regarding Methodology for Determining Material Injury to Reasonable In-Season Demand and Reasonable Carryover or any other Department order. NSGWD proposes to offset all or part of the water the SWC would receive from curtailment of NSGWD's ground water rights by (a) assigning or delivering to the SWC members storage water from reservoirs in the Water District 1 reservoir system, (b) conducting managed Water District 1 reservoir system, (b) conducting managed aquifer recharge, (c) reducing ground water use, (d) fallowing land that would otherwise be irrigated with ground water, or (e) any combination thereof.

The Plan proposes that if NSGWD provides less water to the SWC than is required to fully offset the amount of water the SWC would receive from curtailment, NSGWD members may be subject to curtailment to make up the shortfall, unless NS-

The protest must include a certificate of service showing that a copy of the protest has been mailed or delivered personally to counsel for NSGWD.
