RE: Status of enforcement efforts pursuant to Snake River Farm Amended Curtailment Order dated August 7, 2009

On July 31, 2009, IDWR and Water District 130 staff under my supervision conducted a mass field review of approximately 10,000 irrigated acres under about 185 ground water systems. These acres were authorized under water rights bearing priority dates junior to January 8, 1981, the curtailment date found in the July 22, 2009 Curtailment Order signed by the interim director. The purpose for this field review was to make an initial finding of which irrigated acres under curtailed rights were already idled and in compliance with the curtailment order.

Approximately 6,000 acres from the 1981 curtailment list were flagged for enforcement followup. After the curtailment priority date was advanced to April 11, 1990 by the Amended Order issued August 7, 2009, affected curtailed acres decreased to about 7000, and acres requiring enforcement followup fell to around 3300.

Phase 1 followup, conducted during the week of August 10, included phone contact with water users, comprehensive map and water right analysis, canal share and surface water delivery verifications, and ground water diversion records review, where available. After Phase 1 followup investigations, slightly over 1100 acres remained which were clearly not in compliance with the curtailment order.

Phase 2 followup, conducted on August 13, 14, 17 and 18 by Tim Luke and/or myself, involved field visits to each site and meetings with water users. Water users were informed in person of the requirement to comply with the order. Some individual followup is ongoing, but as of the date of this memo, less than 100 of the critical 1100 irrigated acres remain out of compliance with the August 7 Order.

In addition to irrigation compliance investigations, I have spoken with legal counsel for the two municipalities with curtailed rights (Dietrich and Wendell), and with a representative for a large commercial water user (Glanbia Foods). Both municipalities have senior water rights which can supply sufficient flow to satisfy consumptive uses. City of Wendell has sufficient senior rights to satisfy all of its typical daily demand, and the junior right is not used much. Glanbia Foods' junior right at the Gooding plant is fully mitigated by land-application activities authorized by the water right, so curtailment is not an issue.

At this time I have not yet conducted investigations of small commercial facilities. Dairy facilities participating in the Idaho Dairy Association mitigation plan were removed from the curtailment list. Water use in the facilities still on the list may need to be measured to determine if these facilities are diverting under junior rights or under other, senior rights.

I have not begun ongoing monitoring for the irrigation rights which were determined to be in compliance as of the date of the August 7 Order, or during Phase 2 followup. Common irrigation practices in the Magic Valley include both fall irrigation of grain stubble, and the planting and irrigation of fall cover crops such as triticale or other winter grain. Many of the previously compliant acres were found to be planted in mature grain crops, which are now in the

process of being harvested. Consequently I anticipate those water users may be preparing to irrigate again, and they must be contacted and informed that fall irrigation will not be allowed on curtailed acres.

It is important to note that virtually all of the water users with non-compliant irrigated acres were cooperative and responsive. Some expended significant effort, at their own cost, to bring alternate water supplies to their crops. Many of the remaining non-compliant acres are in beets. Those water users have been willing to talk with investigators and the watermaster, but have been unwilling to commit to a plan of action to idle the affected acres. IDWR may be required to take legal action against certain water users if voluntary compliance cannot be attained.

RE: Accounting of Replacement Water Delivered to NSGWD Conversion Acres

This memo seeks to explain apparent contradictions between recently modeled delivery volumes to the North Snake GWD (NSG) conversion acres, and total replacement water delivery volume as shown in a spreadsheet report received from North Side Canal Co (NSCC), and as referred to by Mr. Randy Budge in his email reply to Phil Rassier on this date.

The contradictions are the result of reference to two or three different spreadsheets which do not necessarily contain or represent the same things. Mr. Budge is correct when he states that "Deliveries through August per NSCC records show 13,403 acre feet." The spreadsheet which was distributed by NSCC with updated replacement deliveries through the end of August shows exactly that. Unfortunately, the spreadsheet included with Mr. Budge's email is not the NSCC spreadsheet. It is a list of names and addresses and acreages for NSG conversion participants who were to continue or resume replacement deliveries in August. This spreadsheet does not show actual deliveries and *does not* include the SRF new conversion participants. However, the 13,403 acre-feet value from NSCC *does* include deliveries to the SRF projects. It also includes an NSCC 30% loss ratio, and delivery of about 700 acre-feet of water in the X-1 lateral for private recharge which is not attributable to any SRF conversion project.

The value which I recently asked Allan Wylie to model was 8385.5 acre-feet. That value is from a spreadsheet I authored in which I utilize the NSCC reported replacement delivery volumes to project headgate delivery amounts to the participating conversion projects through the end of the 2009 irrigation season. The projected value of 8385.5 does not include the SRF project deliveries (shown on the NSCC spreadsheet as Box Canyon Ponds #1, 2 and 3) or the 30% loss charges. Dr. Wylie is using a pre-determined end-of-season value of 3680 acre-feet for the 920 acres in the SRF conversion projects. Dr. Wylie includes the total 30% loss volume separately in modeling runs, as seepage loss spread across the delivery laterals to the projects receiving water.

These seemingly ambiguous values do correlate to one another, although when taken out of context no single one of them entirely represents the facts. Here they are in summary:

7517.06 AF replacement deliveries through August to existing (9300-acre) projects
2249.10 AF replacement deliveries through August to SRF projects
2929.85 AF 30% loss ratio through August to all projects
707.07 AF Faulkner recharge w/ 30% loss in X-1 (not credited to mitigation)
13,403.08 AF Total NSCC diversions charged to NSG through August
12,696.01 AF Total replacement volume eligible for mitigation

I recently received an additional update from NSCC which included replacement deliveries through September 15, 2009. As of that date, approximately 8385 AF had been delivered to existing conversion projects, and approximately 2600 AF had been delivered to the SRF projects.




