

# Executive Order 2020-01 Zero-Base Regulation









- Signed by Governor in January 2020
   <u>https://gov.idaho.gov/wp-</u>
   <u>content/uploads/sites/74/2020/01/eo-2020-01.pdf</u>
- Requires all agencies to undertake "zero-base regulation" review of all their respective rules over a five-year period.
- 2021 marked the first year of the five-year review schedule.
- "...each agency must publish a notice of proposed rulemaking...to repeal the existing rule chapter."













# Executive Order 2020-01 Zero-Base Regulation


- "An agency wishing to renew a rule chapter...must promulgate a new rule..."
  - "The agency must perform a retrospective analysis of the rule chapter to determine whether the benefits the rule intended to achieve are being realized."
  - "...whether [the benefits of the rule] justify the costs of the rule,"
  - "...whether there are less restrictive alternatives to accomplish [the rule's] benefits."





### **Review Negotiated Rulemaking**

Idaho Code § 67-5220 – Notice of Intent to Promulgate Rules – Negotiated Rulemaking









- (3) To facilitate the achievement of the purposes of this section, agencies shall, at a minimum:
  - a. Provide a reasonable period of time for interested persons to respond...;
  - b. Provide notice of meetings to interested persons who responded ...;
  - c. Upon request, make available to persons attending the meetings all information that is considered by the agency in connection with the formulation of the proposed rule...;
  - d. Consider the recommendations of interested persons concerning the subject of the proposed rule;
  - e. Establish, maintain and timely update the negotiated rulemaking schedule and a list of written comments and other documents and information pertinent to the proposed rule and make that information available to persons attending the negotiated rulemaking meeting;
  - f. Prepare a written summary of unresolved issues, key information considered and conclusions reached during and as a result of the negotiated rulemaking...





### **Review Negotiated Rulemaking**

- Negotiated Rulemaking, when determined by the agency to be feasible, "<u>must</u> be conducted by the agency with interested parties."
- Negotiated Rulemaking is "intended to <u>improve the substance of the rule</u> through a consensus building process."
- Negotiated Rulemaking "provides an opportunity for all interested and affected persons and the agency to discuss possible changes to the rule and attempt to reach a <u>consensus</u> on the proposed amendments..."
- Negotiated Rulemaking "is an <u>informal</u> part of the rulemaking process that precedes all formal rulemaking proceedings."
- Negotiated Rulemaking is a negotiation with "stakeholders [about] the very provisions of the rule that they (stakeholders) will be <u>subject to and regulated</u> <u>by</u>."
- Negotiated Rulemaking is an opportunity for stakeholders to "provide <u>input and</u> <u>ideas</u> on the changes the agency is considering."



- May 16, 2024: First Public Meeting
- June 18, 2024: Second Public Meeting
- October 2, 2024: Proposed Rule Publication (to DFM by 8/30/2024)
- January 1, 2025: Pending Rule Publication (to DFM by 11/29/2024)

- Deadline for written comments in connection with this first Strawman is May 31, 2024.
  - o Submitted to <u>rulesinfo@idwr.Idaho.gov</u>
  - Reference the rule chapter: **IDAPA 37.03.01.**
- IDWR will create a revised Strawman Rule based on comments and distribute it by June 12, 2024.
  - May include new content based on comments and internal discussion.
  - Hold a second public meeting on June 18, 2024.
     O Discuss revised strawman and take oral comments.
- Deadline for written comments to 2nd Strawman is July 10, 2024.
- Additional meetings will be scheduled if needed.
  - Goal: Publish Proposed Rule in October 2024 Bulletin.
